Mark Edward Winter is Stewart Title's Executive Vice President of Public Policy. Since 1985, Winter has managed Stewart's Washington, D.C., office and is responsible for the development and coordination of commercial and residential real estate business, procurement of international land titling projects funded by independent federal agencies. He also represents Stewart before Congress, various regulatory agencies and government-sponsored enterprises such as Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac.

In addition to his responsibilities at Stewart, Winter was recently elected President of ALTA. He continues to serve on the Board of Governors of the 3,000 member Association. He also is ALTA's Chairman of its International Development Committee and a member of the TIPAC Board.

In 1995-96, Winter served on the Advisory Board of World Mae, a corporation organized to facilitate the development of a secondary market for home mortgage loans originated in countries throughout the world. He also is a charter member of the International Land Registration Association and the Fannie Mae International Real Estate Roundtable. Also, Winter is a member of the Millennium Water Alliance, a group of nongovernmental organizations with expertise in providing clean, safe water and sanitation services in developing countries. In addition, he is a member of the Living Water International Board -- a non-profit interdenominational Christian ministry providing clean drinking water to people in developing countries, in particular Africa. Prior to joining Stewart, Winter was special assistant to the U.S. Ambassador to Jamaica and was on the professional staff of Reps. Bill Bray (R-Ind.) and Frances Bolton (R-Ohio).

Born in Shaker Heights, Ohio, Winter attended undergraduate and graduate school at Georgetown University.
