## American Land Title Association Urges Full House to Pass Bill Requiring CFPB to Issue Useful, Timely Regulatory Guidance

Washington, D.C., Sept. 14, 2018—The American Land Title Association (ALTA), the national trade association of the land title insurance industry, thanked the House Financial Services Committee for passing HR 5534, the Give Useful Information to Define Effective Compliance Act (GUIDE Compliance Act) on Sept. 13. ALTA urges the full U.S. House of Representatives to pass the bill, which would require the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB) to issue useful guidance to the consumer financial laws it regulates. U.S. Reps. Sean Duffy (R-WI) and Ed Perlmutter (D-CO) introduced the bipartisan bill earlier this year.

"We thank the committee for passing the bill and acknowledging the need for the bureau that matches simple and clear regulations with helpful and illustrative guidance and examples," said Steven G. Day NTP, ALTA's president. "Having the CFPB provide more clarity to the regulations it enforces, such as the Real Estate Settlement Procedures Act (RESPA), allows ALTA members to better serve consumers and deliver peace of mind to homebuyers every day. We encourage the full House to pass the Guide Compliance Act and make it part of the bureau's DNA to support business activity in ways that maximize benefits for consumers."
